Building on State Representative Vanna Howard's Downtown Adopt-a-Street Program, we handed out 33 free sets of buckets and pickers city-wide. Volunteers go out into their neighborhoods to encourage our city to be mindful of where our trash ends up and bring awareness to our belief in a clean city! We have a kit waiting for you.



## FOLK FESTIVAL COMPOST AND RECYCLING TEAM



After some years without recycling separation at the Lowell Folk Festival, we were proud to partner with the Festival Foundation and bring back aluminum and plastic sorting to the festival grounds. Over the course of the weekend, 42 wonderful volunteers saved 225 pounds of aluminum, 250 pounds of plastic, and 8,000 pounds of compostable material from being added to the landfill! ## OPERATION ROSEBUD

For the third winter, we partnered with the Lowell Mayor's Office and Senior Center in order to coordinate snow shoveling assistance to elderly and disabled members of our city. This year, 30 volunteers served 34 neighbors in need. We have a substantial waitlist of people requesting service, and always are looking for more volunteers! # OUR BIGGEST CLEANUP YET



On October 28, we were joined by Triple Threat Organization, Lowell Parks and Conservation Trust, and Gervais Auto Dealerships for a massive cleanup along the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail Extension. 115 volunteers joined us in filling a 30-yard dumpster to the brim in preparation for the City's upcoming paving work to complete this section of the trail.

## SPRING CLEANUP AND CONCERT SERIES

In partnership with Lowell Cultural Affairs and Special Events, we produced a three-event series of cleanups and concerts, in three neighborhoods, with music to match the neighborhood. These events were supported by grants from the Lowell and Mass Cultural Councils, and donations from so many residents and businesses of our city. We danced, ate, and sang along together to celebrate our work that day!
